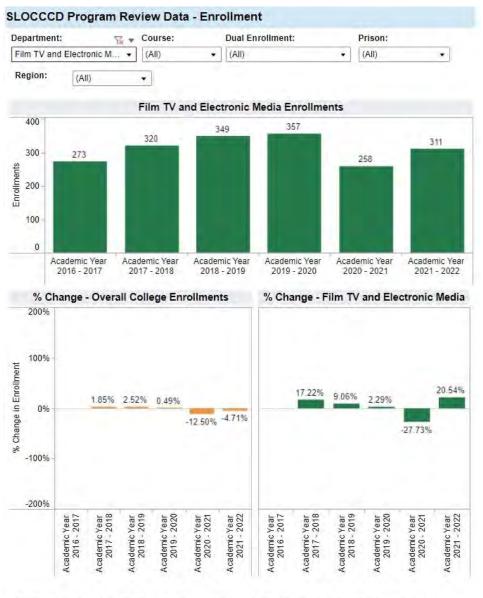

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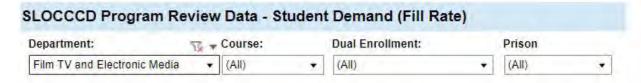

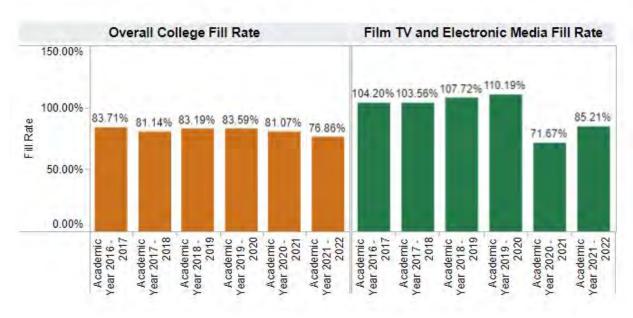

While the enrollment in the college fell by 4.7 percent, FTVE grew by 20.54 percent. In percent growth of enrollment, FTVE is outperforming the college as a whole, and is 48 percent higher than last year.

General Student Demand (Fill Rate) (Insert Aggregated Data Chart) on next page





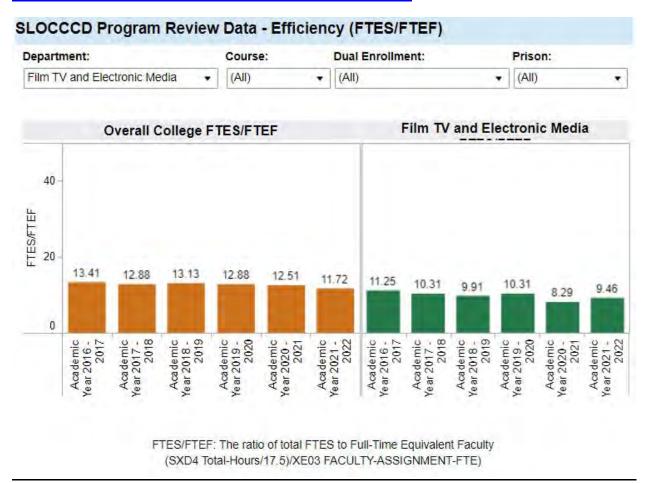

While the college's average fill rate is 76.66%, FTVE outperformed the college again with a fill rate of 85.21%. Although this fill rate is not as high as our pre-COVID number, it is still a 13.54% increase over last year.

FTVE efficiency is low because it is a small program. Efficiency could be raised by increasing the caps in all courses especially in GE transferable courses. The 6101 classroom can now accommodate 30 students. Migrating the "Aesthetics of Cinema" GE course from English, (who doesn't need the efficiency numbers) to FTVE. The lead instructor's load could be reduced from overload to 75%. The disadvantage of this is that there would not be a full-time instructor to fulfill all of the CTE requirements. In the post-COVID world, efficiency could also improve by migrating all class to an on-line modality option.

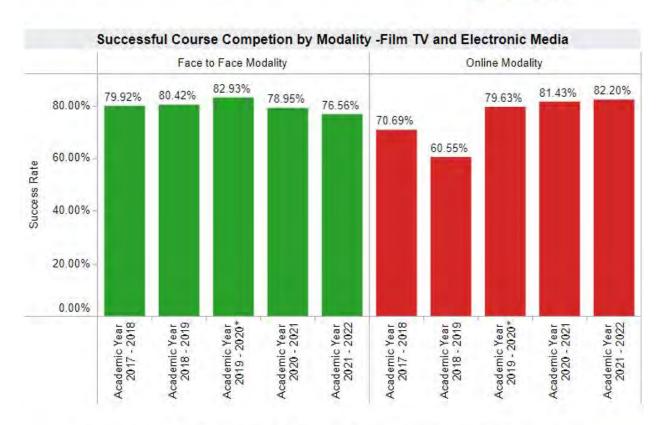

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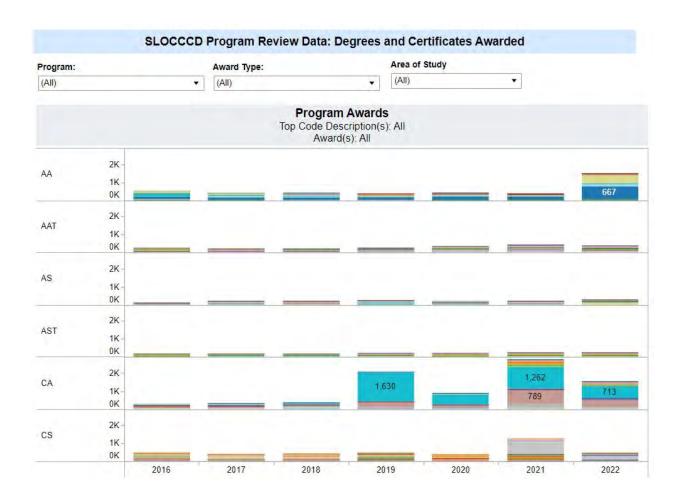

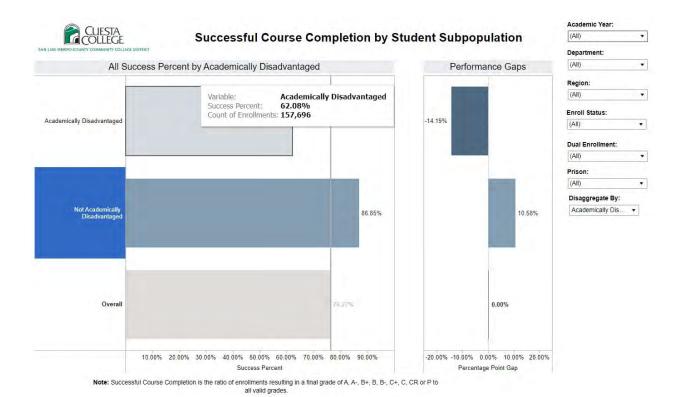
FTVE awards skyrocketed 500% from last year which is much higher than the college average.

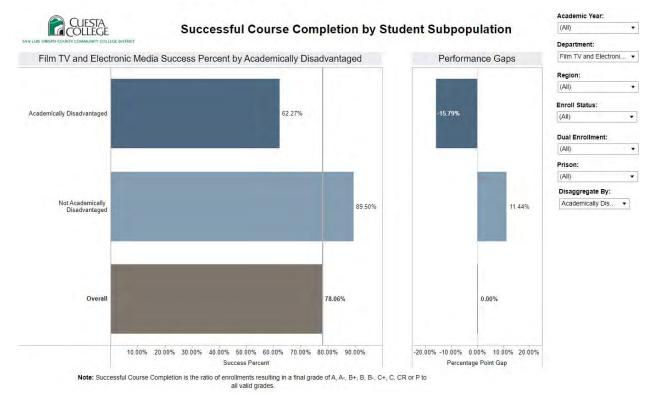

For example, instead of giving a disadvantaged student the attention that they need, I am often fixing equipment just so class and go on because the college let go the lab assistant and repair engineer.
